## Key Objective of the Network

The Network brings together clinicians, managers, patient/family representatives and commissioners from across South Wales and the South West, to work together to support patients of all ages with a congenital heart condition, and their families/carers.

# Main achievements in this reporting period (Q3: Oct - Dec 2022):

### **Clinical**

- Recruited peripheral centres into pilot project for improving transition across the network
- Published and launched four QR code posters to signpost to psychology well-being resources for parents/carers and for children and young people, when in outpatients or pre-admission, and during admission on the ward. These also link to psychology webinars.
- Continued support with recruitment to psychologist posts for ACHD and paediatric service in Bristol
- Annual Network Mortality and Morbidity Forum held for network-wide learning with good engagement and feedback (Oct '22)
- Planning network wide quality improvement/audit session as part of the Clinical Governance Group, including research updates for Jan '23
- Held the network Adult and Paediatric CHD Clinical Nurse Specialist Away Day in Bristol (Nov '22)
- Finalised paediatric guidelines and gain approval via network and governance arrangements in relevant centres
- Launched Cardiff level 2 paediatric and ACHD check-ins
- Substantive cardiac clinical nurse specialist and cardiac physiologist recruited in Truro new posts.





- Updated the network ACHD clinical guidelines and published on the website
- Established task and finish group led by Clinical Director to resolve ECHO and image transfer issues
- Established task and finish group to review anaesthetic pathway for patients requiring non-cardiac surgery. Group to meet on a quarterly basis.

### **Business**

- Appointed a new network clinical director and supported induction started in post in October
- Network Board held (Oct '22) with spotlight on cardiac surgery, and a live patient story reflecting on experience of surgical treatment and communication with patients
- Presented report summarising findings from Welsh self-assessment visits to WHSSC Management Board in collaboration with North West, North Wales & Isle of Man CHD Network with a view to Wales adopting the NHSE CHD Standards and agreeing to implement recommendations (Dec '22)
- Prepared presentations and attended the national CHD networks managers' meeting and conference (Nov '22)
- Led final national network of CHD networks monthly conference call to allow rapid dissemination of information, discussion of clinical cases and shared learning during COVID and restoration period (Sept '22)
- Attended the first meeting of the national network of CHD networks in November with a focus on CHD and PICU surge (Dec'22)
- Reporting of CHD surgical and interventional waiting list information, % CHD activity restoration and escalated issues or risks to NHS England nationally
- Presented on the SWSW CHD Network and Elective Performance to the SW CYP
  Elective Recovery Group
- Continued work with other networks in South West and other developing CHD networks
- Collected data from CHD services (both adults and paediatrics) across the network and populated the 2022/23 performance dashboard ready for review at the network board.
- Held a 2023/24 workplan priorities workshop
- Held CHD Network 'new team' team-building session focussing on strengths, values and priorities
- Met with CHD Network lead psychologist to review lead psychologist involvement in Network team and work through new process for 2023/24
- Reviewed network incident and risk process and prepared draft issues log in line with NHSE Risk Framework process (see revised issues log attached – full log available on request).

### **Education and research**

- Held fetal cardiology for sonographers study day hybrid event (Oct '22)
- Held the second transition study event (Oct'22)
- Held the 20<sup>th</sup> ACHD study day with over 80 delegates (Oct '22)
- Held Cardiology Education Forum in Cardiff with the theme of palliative pathways

- Continued to promote national e-Learning for Health introductory CHD modules SWSW key authors in this
- Network link nurse (level 3) virtual sessions held bi-monthly to enable shared learning and best practice
- Held BRHC link nurse meeting
- Eighth virtual network event held for Cardiac Physiologists across the network to discuss current service provision, share learning and highlight training and education needs (Dec) rolled out to 2023 following positive feedback.
- Continued with monthly bitesize education initiative "Lesion of the month" for all clinical nurse specialists and link nurses across the network.
