The cardiac nurse specialist

The cardiac nurse specialists work as part of a wider team to support children and their families through all stages of their journey within children's cardiac services – from newborns to adolescents transferring to adult cardiac services later in life.

We provide support and advice to parents with age appropriate information for their child, whilst incorporating the skills of a play specialist, clinical psychologist and other health professionals where necessary. This begins from your child's initial diagnosis, throughout childhood, and when transitioning to adult services between the ages of 16 and 18.

We offer support to meet the individual needs of each family in and out of hospital by giving advice, education about the diagnosis and treatment, taking into account any emotional and social needs.

You will meet us at various times throughout your child's journey:

- antenatally at fetal clinics at St Michael's Hospital
- at outpatient appointments at Bristol Royal Hospital for Children
- while staying as an inpatient on ward 32 and PICU.

We will prepare you for any hospital admissions at surgical and pre-assessment clinics, where we take time to explain and answer any questions. We are also able to refer you to other health professionals such as social workers, community children's nurses, psychologists and relevant support groups.

We act as an advocate for you and your child, by supporting you in decision making and when having discussions with other members of the multi-disciplinary team. We are also involved in discharge planning for inpatients to achieve safe and effective transition back into the community, and will follow up with you when you get home. We are available to your health visitor, school nurse, GP and any other professionals involved in your child's care to give them any advice they may need to help care for your child.
