Key Objective of the Network

The Network brings together clinicians, managers, patient/family representatives and commissioners from across South Wales and the South West, to work together to support patients of all ages with a congenital heart condition, and their families/carers.

Main achievements in this reporting period (Q3: Oct-Dec 2020):

Clinical

- Joint fetal pathway between Bristol and Wales approved with aim to evaluate 6-12 months post implementation.
- Paediatric guidelines for Fontan's and Coarctation of the Aorta drafted for review
- Transfer and repatriation policy drafted and approved by Network Clinical Governance Group
- Plan for Fontan's Clinic (complex CHD patients) for BHI in development
- Improved discharge process from paediatric level 1 service presented at Network board
- Engagement exercise with peripheral centres to recruit into pilot project for improving transition across the network.
- Network Clinical Governance group held in December with over 20 joining- session included sharing audit projects, signing off network guidelines and protocols and updates on progress with virtual training and education.
- Continued support with establishment of new consultant post for ACHD service in Truro

Business

- Continue to support centres with their CHD recovery plans. Monthly reporting of CHD surgical and interventional waiting list information, % CHD activity restoration and escalated issues or risks to NHS England.
- Continue to lead National CHD network monthly calls, set up to allow rapid dissemination of information, discussion of clinical cases and shared learning during covid period
- Quarterly reporting to inaugural NHS England South West Women & Children's programme board in November.
- Network Autumn Newsletter published and distributed across network and further afield
- Virtual Network board with over 25 attendees; demonstrated new network performance dashboard, launched nurse competencies and presented proposal for new Fontan's clinic
- Briefing paper and presentation to Welsh Specialised Services to gain agreement to adopt CHD standards across Wales. Positively received and agreed in principle.
- Continued work with newly established networks in South West and other developing CHD networks.
- Initial scoping stage with NHS England and level 1 centre on understanding current peripheral clinic model provision for CHD.
- Hosted first national CHD network manager's forum to enable shared learning and collaborative working on similar challenges and projects.
- CHD Network 2021/22 priority setting workshops held with network board members.
- New and improved Outpatient Performance dashboard finalised for launch in January 2021.



Education and research

- 18th Annual ACHD study day held virtually in October with over 90 delegates from across the region.
- Fetal Cardiology webinar series continues with 130 people registered including clinicians from international centres.
- Nurse competencies for level 3 nurses presented at Network Board and due to be launched across network from February.
- "Meet and Greet" virtual event held for all Cardiac Physiologists across network to discuss current service provision, share learning and highlight training and education needs.
- Continued with monthly bitesize education initiative "Lesion of the month" for all clinical nurse specialists and link nurses across the network.
- Planning underway for Annual Network Psychology virtual event in February 2021
- Planning underway for cardiac nurse education event (level 3), and level 1&2 CNS event in February 2021.
- Webinar series being developed for cardiac nurses (aimed at level 3) survey conducted to determine topics of interest.
- Paediatric Cardiac handbook for nursing staff being finalised to be launched in February.

Communications and Engagement

- Patient and family support webinars launched by psychology team for network wide access
- Patient experience of virtual consultation survey conducted by Welsh Adult CHD CNS team and presented at Clinical Governance Group
- Listening event for Gloucester families hosted by BRHC, well attended and very positively received.
- Out of hours support session set up by Youth worker on a regular basis

Planned Progress for next quarter (Q4: Jan-Mar 2020)

- Host weekly National CHD network calls to respond to increased Covid pressure in system
- Finalise workplan for 2021/22 for submission to NHS England in February and presentation to Network Board in March.
- Recruitment of new Chair for the Network Board
- Plan self-assessment and engagement visits (virtual) with level 3 centres in South Wales from April onwards
- Support WHSSC with development of CHD service specification for Wales based on NHS England standards.
- Review current self-assessment process within network with aim of streamlining and standardising.
- Commence development work on inpatient performance dashboard.
- Launch CHD Nurse Competencies across the network.
- Set up network meeting to discuss approach and management of ICC within CHD network.
- Set up project team and launch project on peripheral clinic provision
- Finalise key SOPs currently in progress (Fontans, Coarctation of Aorta).
- Spring CHD network newsletter to be drafted and published by end of March
- Hold Network Psychology study day, and progress plans for Echo study day
